2001 New Mexico Road Series

All the events of the Series this year are separate events, but all will be offering consistent categories so points can be awarded in a Best All Around format. They will also all be using the same set of race numbers. So, like in past years, please keep the number you get at the first of these events you ride, and reuse that number in the remaining events (unless you change category (A, B, etc)). Each event will be publishing its own flyer; watch for them for details of that event. These are all American Cycling Association events. You'll have the option of an annual membership in ACA (at \$25 for Seniors, \$10 for Juniors) or a one-day license (at \$2 each). This year's events are:

There are small changes in the categories that will be offered this year from years gone by. Here they are:

D	JM 15-16; JW 15-16; JW 17-18; SW Cats. 3,4; SM 50+
E	JM Cat. 4; SM Cat. 4; Citizens
F	JM 10-12; JW 10-12; JM 13-14; JW 13-14

Overall series championships will be based on points won in each event. In each race points will be awarded to 1st thru 15th place as follows: 20, 18, 16, 14, 12, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1. There is one stage race, the Tour of Rio Rancho, in the line up this year. Only the GC of this event will be awarded Series points. This means there are 10 opportunities to score in the Series this year! GC points in the series will be the total of your best 8 out of the 10 chances you got. Points will be accumulated by race series for each event ridden; if you enter some A races and some B races, you will have points in both the A series and the B series. There will be a winner's jersey for series champions in 33 classes based on gender, age, and whatever the biorhythm feature in my son's digital cell phone says I should do at that time:

Once again, I'm sorry, but you cannot register for the entire series in one fell swoop like in years past. You must sign up for each race you want to ride as specified in the flyer for that race. When you **completely** fill out your release/entry form for each event, you **must** indicate which race you will be riding, and not just whatever your ACA category is. Need an example? OK, suppose you're a SM Cat. 3 rider whose racing age is 46 (that's me!). Now take a look back at the categories listed for each race and study it. In this situation, please don't just put Cat 3 on the entry/release form; that doesn't help. As a 40+ Cat 3, you could ride the A race (which reminds you of the good old days), the B race (since you're not training as much now that the boy has moved in with you), or the C race (as long as no one is looking). So, if you've gone to the trouble to preregister, please make it work by letting us know which race (A, B, etc.) you want to ride. And if you haven't preregistered and show up at the table with an **incomplete** release form, you might as well line up with the A race, 'cuz that will be the roster closest at hand to our highly paid, professionally volunteered registration staff.
